EAGLE SCOUT CAPSTONE PROJECT PROCESS



Eagle Scout Service Project Process Scout Name: Date process begins: 1. The Scout comes to Lost River Cave for an Interview and to discuss project ideas with Nature Center Director. 2. The Scout discussed proposed project/s with his Unit leader or Eagle coach. 3. The Scout completes the Eagle Scout Application and returns to Lost River Cave. 4. The Scout completes the Contacts and Project Proposal pages of the Service Project Workbook, signs it, and reviews it with his Eagle coach. 5. Lost River Cave approves and signs the service project workbook Project Proposal. 6. The Unit leader reviews, approves, and signs the Project Proposal. 7. The troop committee reviews, approves, and signs the Project Proposal. 8. The Scout submits the Project Proposal to the District Advancement Chair or District Eagle Coordinator for project approval and signature. 9. The Scout should be sure to plan enough time for this step to be completed before starting his project; this could take up to two months. 10. The project beneficiary signs the Project Report if the project has been completed satisfactorily. A letter of completion from the organization is optional and encouraged.

11. After all the above approvals have been given, the Scout completes the Project Plan pages of the Service Project Workbook.
